


NATHAN'S STORY

Cindy* noticed her son Nathan's* behavior issues when he was just one year old. When Nathan was 18 months old, he was formally diagnosed with Disruptive Behavior Disorder, a disorder that combines symptoms of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Oppositional Defiant Disorder (ODD). He would hit others, act impulsively and had frequent temper tantrums and trouble communicating his needs. "He had no way of letting others know when he needed something," Cindy said. "So instead, he would just get upset and act up." A friend of Cindy's mentioned trying Children & Families of Iowa's (CFI) child care services for help.

CFI's Therapeutic Child Care program (TCC) provides services to children with special behavioral and emotional needs in an environment specialized in meeting those needs. The goal of the program is to provide the children with individualized learning environments where they can develop at their own pace, and eventually be transitioned into general child care.

When Nathan first began attending the TCC, he rarely interacted with other children and instead, would seek attention only from adults. Nathan was screened for specific therapy needs, as all children in the program are. After reviewing his results, staff recommended he be enrolled in speech therapy services. "His speech has really blossomed and his behavior improved remarkably," Cindy said. "He is able to communicate effectively when he needs something instead of acting aggressively." The program has also helped Nathan develop social skills and build positive relationships. "In the beginning, he used to always play by himself or stay with the staff and not interact with other kids," Cindy says. "Now, he has several friends he always talks about."

Because of his improvements, Nathan graduated from the TCC and started preschool. "We really appreciate all that the staff has done for us," said Cindy. "They did an amazing job with him, and I can't thank them enough."
