



In Fiscal Year 2007-2008 Children & Families of Iowa touched the lives of 18,860 children and adults. We served people in all of Iowa's 99 counties. We invested \$11.5 million in making a difference, and \$0.86 of every dollar we receive is spent providing direct services to our clients. All of our programs are licensed or certified, and 97 percent of people we served said our programs focused on what they needed.




### **Foundation for Children of Families of Iowa**

Investing in Hope

The Foundation for Children & Families of Iowa fosters relationships between people who want to help and those who have nowhere else to turn. Together, we are restoring hope, building futures and changing lives for thousands of Iowans every year.

The Foundation is responsible for raising the financial support and public awareness needed so that Children & Families of Iowa can continue offering its many community programs. Last fiscal year, the Foundation for Children & Families of Iowa raised \$3,802,301 to support the agency's programs. Last year, through the support of many generous supporters, the Foundation reached 110% of its fundraising goal.



#### Grants

Every year, the Foundation for Children & Families of Iowa receives grants from a variety of community, family and corporate foundations, as well as public grants at the city, county, state and federal level. The Foundation raised over \$2 million in grants during Fiscal Year 2007-2008.

### **United Way**

The United Way is committed to making an impact in lowa's communities, and we are proud to partner with the United Way to offer vital services across lowa. The United Way supports many of our programs, including Early Childhood Development Services, Therapeutic Child Care, Counseling Services and Domestic Violence Services, as well as services in our Osceola, Fort Dodge and Centerville offices, providing \$814,165 in support last year.

### **In-kind Donations**

Every month, the Foundation for Children & Families of lowa receives hundreds of dollars worth of in-kind donations such as clothing, school supplies, baby supplies, new toiletries and suitcases for our clients.

The Foundation also participates in an annual holiday toy drive, Toys for Kids, through a partnership with Applebees and Carlos O'Kellys restaurants. Last year we collected over 500 toys for children in Iowa.

### **Angels of Courage**

In July 2007, we released Courage to Grow, the third in a series of five Angels of Courage created by Isabel Bloom exclusively for Children & Families of Iowa. Sales of Courage to Grow last year totalled almost \$24,000, and Angels of Courage sales have resulted in \$79,484 raised for Children & Families of Iowa so far.

### **Individual and Corporate Gifts**

During Fiscal Year 2006-2007, 2,930 individuals, organizations and businesses last year contributed \$334,253 for Children & Families of lowa's programs. These gifts are all invaluable in helping us restore hope, build futures and change lives.

On the first Saturday in October, over 209 supporters gathered for Panera Bread's Celebration of Family Walk to raise funds and awareness for domestic violence awareness. The event raised over \$6,500\* from registration fees, donations and Panera Bread sponsorship.

### **Holiday Classic**

The first Sunday in December was supposed to be the date of our annual winter golf and card tournament, the Holiday Classic. However, Old Man Winter had different plans, and we had to cancel the golf tournament, something we've never had to do before. Lucky for us, Triplett Companies was generous enough to host the Texas Hold 'Em tournament on January 27, and we were still able to raise over \$24,000 from sponsorships and entry fees!

#### **Kidsfest**

This year, Kidsfest was still the place to be the second weekend in March. Perennial favorites Spiderman, Veggie Tales and the Fareway Diaper Derby, plus a few new attractions like Curious George, delighted crowds all weekend. We once again teamed up with Veridian Credit Union, and proceeds from sponsorship, booth sales and admissions raised over \$146.000.\*






### **Permission to Soar**


